La Leche League Leaders live and parent in the communities we serve. We provide evidence-based information and personalized support at organized meetings, both in-person and online. We also answer questions and offer encouragement via phone and email. We strive to ensure that all families feel welcome to reach out to us for support.

The LLLC website contains over 130 information sheets on all topics related to breastfeeding. These are written at an accessible reading level and can easily be translated into other languages with available software. We also offer the *Breastfeeding Essentials* class, free of charge, to expectant parents.

La Leche League Canada provides regular educational opportunities for healthcare providers at our annual Healthcare Provider Conference and through our Communication Skills Development course for Healthcare Providers.

The LLLC Social Media Team regularly shares original content on our Facebook and Instagram pages. We continue to explore new ways of increasing engagement with the public. By increasing the visibility of LLLC on social media, we increase the number of people who go to our website for evidence-based breastfeeding information and LLLC Group Meeting details.







LLLC's Volunteers

- 4. Manage their LLLC Group activities
- 5. Work with Leader Applicants and those considering LLL leadership











Leader Accreditation Department

This past year marked an exciting period of growth and innovation for the Leader Accreditation Department (LAD) in Canada. In April 2023, we launched a groundbreaking online virtual Leader Applicant workgroup, designed to address a key challenge in the application process: the barrier of writing. This workgroup offered a unique approach, fostering a sense of connection among Leader Applicants and strengthening their ties to the organization. The success of Canada's initiative has set a precedent, inspiring other LLL Areas around the world to adopt similar models. They began implementing their own versions in early 2024.

In its inaugural year, this workgroup has led to the accreditation of 18 new Leaders across Canada. Remarkably, at least one Leader has been accredited in every region across Canada, including remote areas and fly-in communities. This initiative has not only bolstered leadership within LLLC but has also ensured that Leaders in geographically isolated locations remain engaged and supported.



Finance




Here are some highlights of our year:

- Donations increased by 14% over the previous year.

- Continued efforts were made to reduce professional fees, further enhancing our financial efficiency.



Fundraising

Year in Review



Over the past year, the Board has successfully updated all LLLC policies to ensure alignment with our amended by-laws and current practices. We have also established a systematic process for reviewing these policies every three years, ensuring they remain relevant and effective.

In addition, we have developed an Annual Board Calendar, which details the monthly tasks required of the Board. This calendar serves as a comprehensive guide for current and future Boards, providing new Directors with essential information, offering structure for the Board, and enhancing organizational stability.

In October 2023, we released a new and updated brochure featuring QR codes that link to some of our most popular information sheets. This update has been well-received, with numerous hospitals, midwives, doulas, and community centers reaching out to their local Groups to request these brochures.

La Leche League Canada now offers over 130 up-to-date, evidence-based breastfeeding information sheets, which attract thousands of visitors each week. These resources are written at an accessible reading level, making them easier to understand for those with lower English proficiency and more easily translatable using translation software.

In March, we launched our new Breastfeeding Essentials prenatal class, a comprehensive two-hour session offered by Leaders across the country, both virtually and in-person, at no cost to parents. Additionally, a recorded version of the class is available for purchase for those who prefer to access the material at their convenience. To date, 540 individuals have registered for this valuable resource.

In the coming year, the Board will focus on rewriting the LLLC Board Manual to enhance the orientation of new Directors and guide the Board in fulfilling its responsibilities both now and in the future. A significant emphasis will also be placed on fundraising efforts at both the national and Group levels. We are confident that with increased engagement in fundraising, we can continue to advance our mission for many years to come.
