PUBLICATIONS

Definition

An LLLC publication is defined as any information sheets, social media post, book, booklet, handbook, manual, leaflet, joint publication, Leader newsletter, public newsletter, audio recording, video recording, reproduction, multimedia resource, or media article written on behalf of LLLC, as indicated by the LLLC logo, that is widely available or distributed to the public or Leaders in Canada. Area letters/memos, departmental letters/memos, posters and conference materials are not considered publications.

<u>Philosophy</u>

All LLLC publications shall reflect LLL philosophy, and abide by the policy of not mixing causes. See *LLLC Code of Conduct Section 5*.

Permission

LLLC copyrighted materials may be printed and shared. The LLLC logo and name must not be removed from copies or reproductions. Photos, charts and diagrams must not be altered or replaced, but they may be removed entirely from the document.

Acknowledgements by LLLC

Brief acknowledgements of sponsors or donors are acceptable on LLLC publications and promotional materials. The acceptance of the acknowledgement does not constitute endorsement by LLLC. The interests of sponsors or donors may not be incompatible with *LLLC By-laws and Policies*.

LLLC publications, as defined in this policy, developed by LLLC Leaders in the course of their LLLC Leader work are the property of LLLC.
